- ▶ Founder: Rev. Dr. E.A. Abraham a native from South India.
- ▶ Initial Location: Siwan, Bihar.
- ▶ Mode of Outreach: Mostly alone, with three people joining after 10 years.

- Initial Focus: House meetings, distributing Christian literature, and training disciples.
- Challenges: Social rejection, language barriers, threats of violence, severe persecution, and untouchability.
- ▶ Early Activities: Small congregation, house churches, weekly services, and limited outreach.

2024: Growth and Impact

- **▶** Network Expansion:
 - Churches: From 1 to over 200 Central Churches, daughter churches, and hundreds of House Churches across 13 states.
 - **Bible Colleges:** 17 branches across 4 states for training future missionaries and church leaders.
 - Mission Schools: 7 in Bihar providing quality education to marginalized communities.
 - Orphanages: 2 providing care and support for vulnerable children.
- Core Initiatives that Help Preach the Gospel:
 - Education: Mission schools, literacy programs for

- adults, and scholarships for higher education.
- Empowerment: Training for women, child welfare programs, and protection against abuse and trafficking.
- Community Development: Healthcare services, disaster relief, and rural development projects.

From Humble Beginnings to Flourishing Ministry

'Winning three souls in the state of Bihar was like winning thousands elsewhere'

Abraham's Call to Be a Missionary

Rev. E.A. Abraham started his journey in Kerala, India. Due to his family's financial struggles, he moved to Bangalore to pursue a bachelor's degree. However, he faced severe depression and almost ended his life by lying in front of a moving train. A mysterious voice urged him to read the Bible, leading him to Ecclesiastes 7:16-18, which could save him from taking his life. This divine message led him to repentance and prayer, pulling him back from despair.

Abraham found a job at the Bangalore Postal Department. Six months later, he had a vision from the Lord, calling him to do His



work. Initially reluctant, another vision strengthened his resolve to become an evangelist.

The Great Move from Bangalore to Bihar

Guided by his pastor, Abraham joined Operation Mobilization (OM) in Bangalore, receiving training and studying God's Word. He also worked with the Friends Missionary Prayer Band (FMPB) before being called to North India.

In 1984, Abraham, a young bachelor, travelled 1,650 miles over three days

to Siwan in Bihar with a vision to reach the unreached. This marked a significant chapter in his life and of Hope India Mission.

Ten Years of Waiting and Burden to Harvest the First Fruit

Bihar presented immense challenges with its unfamiliar customs, language, and severe social barriers. The streets were chaotic and dirty, and Christians were viewed as the lowest caste. Abraham often faced contempt and life-threatening situations for his faith.

Early Days

He began his ministry by distributing Gospel booklets in and around Mairwa, traveling on foot, and enduring humiliation and threats. Despite these difficulties, he gathered followers in small huts and spent nights in barns with animals, and hundreds of mosquitoes gave him company!.

Devdas, a supportive companion, joined Abraham on mission visits to remote villages. Despite severe opposition and many temptations to quit, Abraham remained steadfast in his calling.

After ten tough years, three people were added to his church. While this seemed modest, it was significant given Bihar's reputation as the "Graveyard of Missions," where many missionaries saw no results. Winning three souls in Bihar was like winning thousands elsewhere, highlighting the difficulty of evangelism in the 1980s and 1990s. Facing cultural and social barriers, Rev. Abraham persevered, establishing the first mission field in Siwan, Bihar. This initial step laid the groundwork for a movement of faith that would reach far and wide.

Expanding Reach

Today, HIM boasts a vast network encompassing 200+ Central Churches, hundreds of House Churches spread across villages and towns.. A Bible college with 17 branches across four states equips future missionaries and church leaders. Additionally, seven mission schools provide quality education, and numerous social welfare projects address critical needs in nine states. And two orphanages provide a safe haven for vulnerable children.



HIM's Impact on Education and Social Upliftment

Education as a Cornerstone

- **→** Mission Schools: Operates seven schools offering quality education to marginalized children, focusing on academics, character, and spiritual values.
- **⊃** Scholarship Programs: Provides scholarships for higher education to deserving students, removing financial barriers.
- → Adult and Child Literacy Centers: Improves basic literacy in reading, writing, and arithmetic for adults and children.

Empowering Women and Children

- ⇒ Child Welfare: Runs two orphanages providing care, education, and emotional support.
- **⊃** Women's Empowerment: Offers workshops on health, hygiene, financial literacy, and vocational skills.
- **⇒** Child Protection: Collaborates with authorities to protect children from abuse and trafficking.

Community Development and Social Welfare

- → Healthcare: Conducts medical camps and preventive healthcare programs.

- Church Construction: Build 100 churches, each costing approximately \$10,000 to \$15,000, to create dedicated worship spaces.
- 2. Empowering Pastors and Ministry
- ⊃ Motorbike Distribution: Provide 100 motorbikes to new and existing pastors to enhance mobility and outreach capabilities.
- Orphanage Expansion: Accommodate 50 additional children in our orphanage, covering all living and educational expenses.
- **⇒** Bible College Expansion: Add 10 dormitory rooms to our Bible College to support leadership training.
- 3. Youth and Children's Ministries
- **⇒** Youth and Children's Outreach: Organize Youth Competitions and Children's Camps, including newly reached areas.
- ⇒ VBS and Awana Programs: Expand Vacation Bible Schools and Awana Leadership Programs to 100 more locations.

- **⊃** Teacher's Training: Conduct a Teacher's Training and Empowering Conference to equip educators.
- ⊃ Youth Leaders Training: Implement a central Youth Leaders Training program to develop future leaders.
- 5. Adult Literacy and **Education Aid**
- ⊃ Adult Literacy Programs: Launch programs in at least hundred new fields to promote literacy among the ultra-poor.
- **⊃** Education Aid: Raise funds for Education Aid and Tuition Classes for the needy.
- **⊃** Scholarships: Offer scholarships for higher education to widows and deserving children.
- **⊃** Backpack projectors: 50 projectors to reach many with literacy programs and then with Jesus Films and other videos.
- 6. Major Projects
- **⊃** Patna City Church: Complete the Patna City Church project to reach high-class, high-caste individuals and diplomats.
- ⇒ Chhattisgarh Tribal Development Project: Focus on improving living standards in tribal communities by establishing a trade school, Bible school, widow's home, orphanage, and mission school.
